Usage of Syringe for G-Tubing Venting


Properly administering your medication at home is important to your safety. In the event of an emergency, call 911.


SUPPLIES:

- 60ml syringe
- "Y" connector

PROCEDURE:

- Clean work area. Wash hands thoroughly for at least 20 seconds. Gather supplies.
- 2. Place a "Y" connector into the feeding tube.
- 3. Place the tubing from the feeding bag into one side of the "Y."
- 4. Place a 60ml catheter tip syringe (without the plunger) into the other side of the Y. Venting syringe must be kept elevated 4 6 inches above the stomach to avoid a siphon effect. Wrap tape around the top of the syringe allowing enough tape to make a tab that can be pinned to the infants clothing or suspended from the crib rail.
- Some patients will be ordered to remain vented at all times, while others may just be vented after a feeding then clamped. Follow the orders provided from you doctor.
